HB 345 ON THIRD READING (by Flynn)

HB 345 - STATEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE INTENT

REPRESENTATIVE AYCOCK: Representative Flynn, I believe there's an amendment that's been added to this that carves out the counties from this bill. Is that correct?

REPRESENTATIVE FLYNN: That's correct. It was done on second reading.

AYCOCK: Could you please tell me the types of entities that would still be pooling these assets together and these collateralization pools?

FLYNN: I don't understand your question.

AYCOCK: Could you please tell me the types of entities that would still have their assets pooled?

FLYNN: We still have our school districts, water districts, and cities—any public funds other than the counties because they asked to be opted out.

AYCOCK: And the counties requested to be carved out of this bill, basically?

FLYNN: That's correct.

AYCOCK: The collateralization of these entities is presently done, I believe, by mostly community based banks. Is that a correct understanding?

FLYNN: What they do is they have contracts. The public entities have a contract with the individual banks, so they have an individual bank, and sometimes the collateral can be held by a federal reserve bank, or can be held by other banks. Does that answer your question?

AYCOCK: Yes, thank you. On page 1, line 19 of your bill, it refers to single participating institutions deposits. That's basically the mode that we're in under present law, is that correct?

FLYNN: That's correct.

AYCOCK: But then on lines 20 and 21, it refers to one or more collateral pools with centralized collateralization, and by two or more identifiable participating institutions.

FLYNN: It says, "may", it says "may." That would be an option.

AYCOCK: Okay, but it would set up situations where more than one entity, i.e., hospital districts, down to a city, could put their assets in that pool.

FLYNN: Only if that's what they choose. This bill does not require that at all.

AYCOCK: Okay, and that pool could have pledges from more than one bank. Is that a correct understanding?

FLYNN: It says that they may, but that's not the procedure that's set up, and the pool is going to be held for each bank, and each bank and each public entity has their own contract with their financial institution.

AYCOCK: Okay, let me set up a hypothetical. If three banks, A, B, and C, put collateral into that pool, and if that collateral was all pooled in one place, and bank C has a problem. Does that reflect negatively on the securities that are pledged—

FLYNN: No, not at all. It's the same thing. If you walk into your local bank, do you expect to find a box with your name on it and all of your money there? This is the same thing. Well, some do, but what we're doing is trying to move to the electronic age. We're trying to take advantage of issues that are available for us, and you will have a contract—the public entities—would have a contract with their banks—whatever their contract would be—and then that bank would have a pool of their collateral to be shared with those other public entities, but it's just their bank. The comptroller would keep track of those, the comptroller would be giving them a periodical report.

AYCOCK: So, how does that create a cross collateralization in that situation then? If banks A and B are not responsible if bank C has a problem, and its negative findings reflect on that pool, does that—

FLYNN: I don't understand your question because each bank is going to have their own contracts with their public entity and those securities are going to be held at the comptroller's, or at the federal reserve.

AYCOCK: These banks' collateral would be held separately and that bank would be held accountable only for that?

FLYNN: That's correct. Bank A would not share their collateral with bank B unless they choose to do an agreement like that.

AYCOCK: So a failure on bank C would not reflect negatively on bank A or B.

FLYNN: Not at all, not at all.

REPRESENTATIVE HERRERO: Representative Callegari, yesterday there was an amendment that was added by Representative Puente, is that correct?

REPRESENTATIVE CALLEGARI: Yes.

HERRERO: And that amendment stripped Section 2 of HB 3298, is that correct?

CALLEGARI: That's correct.

HERRERO: So the only provisions that exist, then, are under Section 1 of **HB 3298**, is that correct?

CALLEGARI: Yes.

HERRERO: Do you intend to ensure that when the bill goes to the senate, that Section 2 is not added to the bill?

CALLEGARI: I can't control what happens in the senate.

HERRERO: Right, I understand about whether we control things or not in the senate, but my question to you, then, is specifically, is your effort, then, going to be to ensure that the bill as we—

CALLEGARI: I'm not going to say that, I don't know.

HERRERO: So is it that you-

CALLEGARI: I don't know what I'm going to do.

HERRERO: Okay. On that rationale, then, as the bill currently stands right now, **HB 3298** deals with only one section. That is that municipalities and special districts no longer would have to accomodate persons with disabilities in accessing voting places. Is that correct?

CALLEGARI: Yes, it really addresses particularly a problem that smaller communities have, where the cost of providing the voting machines is extremely expensive.

HERRERO: Right, but whether we're talking about large municipalities or small communities, as your intention is, the point of this bill is so that small municipalities, then, would not have to make accommodations to persons with disabilities to access polling places. Is that correct?

CALLEGARI: It's not intended to limit access, it's intended to help the cities who have extremely high expenses. There is no intention to try to limit the ability of anyone to vote, and I would anticipate that most communities would do whatever they can to make sure that those people with disabilities do vote, and I would certainly expect, and would want them, to do that.

HERRERO: Right. So the intent of the bill is not to somehow limit or restrict persons with disabilities to have the opportunity to vote or to have access to the voting places?

CALLEGARI: That's correct. It's not to restrict anyone. I didn't intend it to restrict anyone.

The citizen member of the board serves the same term of office as the district judge in Jim Hogg County.

(b) The district judge is the chairman of the board and its chief administrative officer.

(c) The commissioners court may pay the juvenile board members an annual salary set by the commissioners court at not less than \$1,200 or more than \$3,600 for the added duties imposed on the members. The salary shall be paid in equal monthly installments from the general fund of the county.

(d) The juvenile board shall appoint not more than five persons to serve on an advisory council.

(e) The Jim Hogg County Juvenile Board and the juvenile boards of one or more counties that are adjacent to or in close proximity to Jim Hogg County may agree to operate together with respect to all matters, or with respect to certain matters specified by the juvenile boards. Juvenile boards operating together may appoint one fiscal officer to receive and disburse funds for the boards.

(f) Sections 152.0002, 152.0004, 152.0005, 152.0006, 152.0007, and 152.0008 do not apply to the juvenile board.

SECTION _____. Section 152.2201, Human Resources Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

(a) The Starr County Juvenile Board is composed of the county judge, the judge of the county court at law in Starr County, and the district judges in Starr County.

(f) The Starr County Juvenile Board and the juvenile boards of one or more counties that are adjacent to or in close proximity to Starr County may agree to operate together with respect to all matters, or with respect to certain matters specified by the juvenile boards. Juvenile boards operating together may appoint one fiscal officer to receive and disburse funds for the boards.

SECTION _____. The Jim Hogg County Juvenile Board is created October 1, 2007.

(2) for each child committed to a facility described by Subdivision (1):
(A) a general description of the offense committed by the child or

the conduct of the child that led to the child's commitment to the facility;

(B) the year the child was committed to the facility; and

(C) the age range, race, and gender of the child.

(b) Not later than the 10th day following the first day of each quarter, a juvenile court judge shall update the information posted on a county Internet website under Subsection (a).

Sec. 58.353. CONFIDENTIALITY. A record posted on a county Internet website under this subchapter may not include any information that personally identifies a child.

(c) The changes in law made by this section apply only to a child committed to a correctional facility operated by the Texas Youth Commission on or after January 1, 2008.

(A) <u>causing or</u> threatening to cause bodily injury to the person or another person or otherwise causing the person performing or providing labor or services to believe that the person or another person will suffer bodily injury;

(B) restraining <u>or threatening to restrain the person or another</u> person in a manner described by Section 20.01(1) <u>or causing the person</u> performing or providing labor or services to believe that the person or another person will be restrained; [or]

(C) knowingly destroying, concealing, removing, confiscating, or withholding from the person or another person, or threatening to destroy, conceal, remove, confiscate, or withhold from the person or another person, the person's actual or purported:

(i) government records;

(ii) identifying information; or

(iii) personal property;

(D) threatening the person with abuse of the law or the legal process in relation to the person or another person;

(E) threatening to report the person or another person to immigration officials or other law enforcement officials or otherwise blackmailing or extorting the person or another person;

(F) exerting financial control over the person or another person by placing the person or another person under the actor's control as security for a debt to the extent that:

(i) the value of the services provided by the person or another person as reasonably assessed is not applied toward the liquidation of the debt;

(ii) the duration of the services provided by the person or another person is not limited and the nature of the services provided by the person or another person is not defined; or

(iii) the principal amount of the debt does not reasonably reflect the value of the items or services for which the debt was incurred; or

(G) using any scheme, plan, or pattern intended to cause the person to believe that the person or another person will be subjected to serious harm or restraint if the person does not perform or provide the labor or services.

(2) "Traffic" means to transport, [another person or to] entice, recruit, harbor, provide, or otherwise obtain another person by any means [for transport by deception, coercion, or force].

SECTION _____. Subsections (a) and (b), Section 20A.02, Penal Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) A person commits an offense if the person:

(1) knowingly traffics another person with the intent or knowledge that the trafficked person will engage in $[\div$

[(1)] forced labor or services; or

(2) intentionally or knowingly benefits from participating in a venture that involves an activity described by Subdivision (1), including by receiving labor or services the person knows are forced labor or services [conduct that constitutes an offense under Chapter 43].

(b) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, an offense under this section is a felony of the second degree. An offense under this section is a felony of the first degree if:

(1) the applicable conduct constitutes an offense under Section 43.02[offense is committed under Subsection (a) (2)] and the person who is trafficked is younger than 18 [14] years of age at the time of the offense; or

(2) the commission of the offense results in the death of the person who is trafficked.

SECTION _____. Section 125.002, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is amended by adding Subsection (f-1) to read as follows:

(f-1) If the defendant required to execute the bond is a hotel, motel, or similar establishment that rents overnight lodging to the public and the alleged common nuisance is under Section 125.0015 (a) (6) or (7), the bond must also be conditioned that the defendant will, in each of the defendant's lodging units on the premises that are the subject of the suit, post in a conspicuous place near the room rate information required to be posted under Section 2155.001, Occupations Code, an operating toll-free telephone number of a nationally recognized information and referral hotline for victims of human trafficking.

(1) outlining how existing social service programs address or fail to address the needs of victims of human trafficking;

(2) with respect to those needs, outlining the interplay of existing social service programs with federally funded victim service programs; and

(3) recommending areas of improvement and modifications in existing social service programs.

SECTION _____. Sections 20A.01 and 20A.02, Penal Code, as amended by this Act apply only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs before the effective date.

SECTION _____. Subsection (f-1), Section 125.002, and Subsection (a-1), Section 125.045, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, as added by this Act, apply only to a suit filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A suit filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

Sec. 309.052. HEARING. Before creating a district, the governing body of a municipality must hold a hearing on the purposes and advisability of creating the district. Any interested person may speak at the hearing.

Sec. 309.053. ORDER CREATING DISTRICT; INITIAL DIRECTORS. (a) After a hearing under Section 309.052, if a governing body finds that the municipality and the designated area would benefit from the district's creation, the governing body by order may create the district.

(b) The order must specify:

(1) the district's boundaries, which must be wholly in the municipality;

(2) the number and qualifications of directors to be appointed under Section 309.103; and

(3) the initial directors and the terms of those initial directors, consistent with Subsection (c).

(c) The initial directors' terms must be staggered, with as near as possible to half of the directors' terms expiring on the same date in not more than one year and the remainder expiring on the same date in not more than two years.

[Sections 309.054-309.100 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER C. BOARD OF DIRECTORS Sec. 309.101. GOVERNING BODY. A district is governed by a board of at least seven directors. Sec. 309.102. TERMS. The governing body of a municipality that creates a district shall appoint the directors as provided by the order creating the district. The directors must include: (1) two directors who represent the interests of the municipality and reside in the municipality; (2) one director who represents a local or regional film commission that: (A) is part of an international professional and educational organization for film commissions; and (B) has an office located in the municipality, if a film commission described by Paragraph (A) has an office located in the municipality; (3) one director who represents a school district that has the majority of its territory located in the municipality; (4) one director who represents an institution of higher education, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, located in the municipality; (5) one director who represents a public junior college, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, located in the municipality; and (6) any other directors as provided by the order creating the district. Sec. 309.104. COMPENSATION; EXPENSES. A director is not entitled to compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses. Sec. 309.105. OFFICERS. A board shall elect a presiding officer, secretary, treasurer, and any other officers the board considers necessary. [Sections 309.106-309.150 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER D. POWERS AND DUTIES Sec. 309.151. PROMOTION OF FILM INDUSTRY. A district shall promote the film industry in the district. Sec. 309.152. PARTNERSHIP WITH LOCAL COMMUNITIES. A district shall act jointly with the municipality, local businesses, the film industry, and other local communities to promote the film industry in the district. Sec. 309.153. INCENTIVES. A district may provide incentives to promote the film industry in the district. Sec. 309.154. DONATIONS; GRANTS. A district may accept a donation or grant from any person for any district purpose. FINANCIAL PROVISIONS Sec. 309.201. BORROWING. A district may borrow money from any person for any district purpose.

(3) conduct an interview with a family member of a recipient of home health, hospice, or personal assistance services who is deceased or other person who may have knowledge of the care received by the deceased recipient of the home health, hospice, or personal assistance services; or

(4) interview a physician or other health care practitioner, including a member of the personnel of a home and community support services agency, who cares for a recipient of home health, hospice, or personal assistance services.

SECTION _____. Section 253.001(4), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(4) "Facility" means:

(A) a facility licensed by the department; [or]

(B) an adult foster care provider that contracts with the department;

or

(C) a home and community support services agency licensed by the department under Chapter 142.

SECTION _____. Section 253.008, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 253.008. VERIFICATION OF EMPLOYABILITY. (a) Before a facility[, an agency licensed under Chapter 142,] or a person exempt from licensing under Section 142.003(a)(19) may hire an employee, the facility[, agency,] or person shall search the employee misconduct registry under this chapter and the nurse aide registry maintained under the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1987 (Pub. L. No. 100-203) to determine whether the applicant for employment is designated in either registry as having abused, neglected, or exploited a resident or consumer of a facility or an individual receiving services from a facility [an agency licensed under Chapter 142] or from a person exempt from licensing under Section 142.003(a)(19).

(b) A facility[, agency licensed under Chapter 142,] or a person exempt from licensing under Section 142.003(a)(19) may not employ a person who is listed in either registry as having abused, neglected, or exploited a resident or consumer of a facility or an individual receiving services from <u>a facility</u> [an <u>agency licensed under Chapter 142</u>] or from a person exempt from licensing under Section 142.003(a)(19).

SECTION _____. Section 253.009(a), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) Each facility[, each agency licensed under Chapter 142,] and each person exempt from licensing under Section 142.003(a)(19) shall notify its employees in a manner prescribed by the department:

(1) about the employee misconduct registry; and

(2) that an employee may not be employed if the employee is listed in the registry.

SUBCHAPTER C. INFORMATION ON ALTERNATIVE TREATMENTS FOR LUNG CANCER

Sec. 86.101. PURPOSE. It is the intent of the legislature that lung cancer patients have access to a standardized written summary, as provided under this subchapter, of medically efficacious and viable alternative treatments for lung cancer, which may include surgical, radiological, or chemotherapeutic treatment or combinations of those treatments.

Sec. 86.102. STANDARDIZED WRITTEN SUMMARY. (a) The department shall publish a standardized written summary, in language a patient can understand, of the advantages, disadvantages, risks, and descriptions of all medically efficacious and viable alternatives for the treatment of lung cancer.

(b) The department shall update the summary annually, if necessary, to reflect changes in the treatment of lung cancer. (c) The advisory council shall develop the summary.

Sec. 86.103. ADVISORY COUNCIL. (a) The lung cancer advisory council is appointed by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.

(b) The lung cancer advisory council consists of the following three members:

(1) one member who is a physician active in the treatment of lung cancer;

(2) one member who is an advocate for lung cancer patients; and

(3) one member of the public who is a survivor of lung cancer.

Sec. 86.104. DISTRIBUTION OF SUMMARY. (a) Not later than the 90th day after the date the department receives the standardized written summary from the advisory council, the department shall print and make available to all physicians in the state sufficient copies of the summary. (b) A physician may distribute the summary to a patient when the physician

determines in the physician's professional judgment that it is in the best interest of the patient to receive a copy of the summary.

Sec. 86.105. FUNDING. (a) The department may not expend general revenue funds for the publication or distribution of the standardized written summary.

(b) The department may provide technical assistance to the advisory council

to aid in the development of the summary. (c) The department may accept grants, donations of money or materials, and other forms of assistance from private and public sources to be used solely for the development and distribution of the summary.

(2) On page 14, between lines 23 and 24, insert the following:

(c) The members of the research and prevention programs committee must represent the geographic and cultural diversity of the state.
