The initial members of the three-member district board would be appointed by the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission upon receipt of a petition of holders of a majority of the land value in the district. Board members would be elected to four-year staggered terms. The voters of the district would have to confirm its creation in an election.

The district could levy an assessment against all taxable real property in the district and could issue bonds or certificates of assessment, approved by district voters and secured by assessment revenue.

The bill would take immediate effect if approved by two thirds of the membership of each house.
