BACKGROUND: Current law does not prohibit the Legislature from meeting on legal holidays.

> Generally speaking, the Legislature meets in regular session on six legal holidays, including Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Confederate Heroes Day, Presidents' Day, Texas Independence Day, San Jacinto Day, and Memorial

Day.

DIGEST: HB 3552 would prohibit the Legislature from meeting on the legal holiday for

the observance of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday.

This bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record

vote of the membership of each house.
