

- SUBJECT:** Permitting interlocal agreements with states not bordering Texas

- BACKGROUND:** Government Code, sec. 791.003 limits the ability of Texas local governments, including cities, counties, and special districts, to sign interlocal cooperation agreements with local governments located in the bordering states of Louisiana, Arkansas, Oklahoma, and New Mexico. Government Code, sec. 791.011 places a similar limitation on the ability of state agencies to enter into interlocal cooperation agreements with state agencies in those states.
- DIGEST:** HB 884 would amend Government Code, secs. 791.003 and 791.011 to eliminate the reference to bordering states and would allow local governments and state agencies to enter into interlocal agreements with local governments and state agencies in any state in the union.
- This bill would take effect September 1, 2001.
