SUBJECT: Local government political contribution and expenditure reporting

COMMITTEE: Elections — favorable, without amendment

BACKGROUND: In December 2008, the Texas Ethics Commission issued a report

recommending a variety of statutory changes, including allowing local governments to use commission software and hardware to file required

disclosure reports online.

DIGEST: SB 2242 would allow Texas Ethics Commission software and resources to

be used for the filing of political contribution and expenditure reports by:

- local government entities;
- local government officers;
- candidates for local government offices, and;
- specific-purpose committees for supporting, opposing, or assisting a local government officer, candidate, or entity.

The Texas Ethics Commission could provide assistance to a local government entity, officer, candidate, or specific-purpose committee by developing software to facilitate electronic filing, maintaining reports on political contributions and expenditures, and providing public access to the electronic reports through the commission's website, and could enter into an intergovernmental contract with a local government entity to provide assistance. Any provision of the bill would not be mandatory during a fiscal period for which the Legislature did not make a specific appropriation to implement the provision.

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The bill would take effect September 1, 2009.

NOTES:

The Legislative Budget Board estimates that the Texas Ethics Commission would need updated software and two additional staff to provide training and assistance with information requests, at a cost of about \$2.6 million in fiscal 2010-2011 and about \$600,000 for each succeeding biennium.

A similar bill, HB 3924 by Peña, reported favorably, as substituted, by the House Elections Committee on April 17.
