BACKGROUND: Government Code sec. 431.134 allows the adjutant general to adopt rules

and regulations for the issuance of 12 different military service medals including the: Texas Faithful Service Medal, Federal Service Medal, Texas Medal of Merit, Texas Outstanding Service Medal, Texas State Guard Service Medal, Texas Desert Shield/Desert Storm Campaign Medal, Texas Humanitarian Service Medal, Texas Calvary Medal, Texas Combat Service Ribbon, Texas Purple Heart Medal, Texas Superior

Service Medal, and Texas Homeland Defense Service Medal.

DIGEST: CSHB 973 would allow the adjutant general to adopt rules and regulations

for issuance of the Texas Iraqi Campaign Medal and the Texas

Afghanistan Campaign Medal for service during Operation Iraqi Freedom,

Operation New Dawn, or Operation Enduring Freedom.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take

effect September 1, 2011.
