DIGEST: CSHB 1015 would require a food service establishment with a designed

or designated space for eating that prepared a food item containing

peanuts or a peanut product to post a warning sign in a conspicuous place in the area of the establishment in which food was consumed or on the menu. The sign would be required to state, "This establishment prepares

food items that contain peanut products."

The executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services

Commission would be required to adopt any necessary rules to implement

the bill's provisions.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2020.
