BACKGROUND: Occupations Code ch. 2302 governs salvage vehicle dealers, who are

required to hold a license issued by the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles. Under sec. 2302.204, a person who purchases fewer than five nonrepairable motor vehicles or salvage vehicles is exempted from the

salvage vehicle dealer license requirement.

It has been noted that licensed independent motor vehicle dealers must hold a separate salvage dealer license in order to purchase more than five

salvage vehicles per year.

DIGEST: CSHB 1667 would extend statutory provisions that currently apply to a

licensed salvage vehicle dealer to the holder of an independent motor vehicle dealer's general distinguishing number if the motor vehicle dealer acted as a salvage vehicle dealer or rebuilder or stored or displayed a

vehicle as the agent of an insurance company.
