BACKGROUND: Some have noted that after natural disasters it can be difficult for property

owners to find qualified tradespeople to rebuild damaged homes and that some property owners in such situations have been taken advantage of by

fraudulent contractors.

DIGEST: HB 1873 would require the Texas Division of Emergency Management by

November 1, 2020, to submit a report to the Legislature on improving the oversight, accountability, and availability of building trade services after a

disaster.

The report would include:

- strategies to increase the availability of tradespeople following a disaster;
- approaches to increase prosecutions of alleged fraud related to building trade services offered following a disaster; and
- methods to encourage performance bond requirements in contracts for trade services to be performed following a disaster.

The division would be required to consult with appropriate state entities, including the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation, local governments, trade associations, and law enforcement groups in preparing the report.

The bill's provisions would expire January 1, 2021.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2019.
