BACKGROUND: Parks and Wildlife Code sec. 43.357 permits the Texas Parks and Wildlife

Commission to regulate deer breeding.

DIGEST: HB 1781 would require the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission

(TPWC) to allow the holder of a valid deer breeder's permit to engage in

the business of breeding breeder deer, including the propagation of breeder deer by cloning. TPWC would be able to make regulations

governing the propagation of breeder deer by cloning.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take

effect September 1, 2021.
