BACKGROUND: Concerns have been raised about the accessibility of information on

occupational licensing for military service members, military spouses, and

veterans. Some have called for the Legislature to ensure that this information is readily accessible through state agencies issuing occupational licenses and the Texas Veterans Commission.

DIGEST: HB 2740 would require a state agency that issued an occupational license

to post on its internet website a list of the licenses issued by the agency with a description of the type of business or occupation covered by each license. Such a state agency would have to post the required information

and provide a direct link to the information to the Texas Veterans

Commission by December 1, 2021.

The information would have to be posted prominently on the home page

of the agency's website or on a single page of the website with a

prominent link on the home page.

By January 1, 2022, the Texas Veterans Commission would have to post the links on a single page of the Texas Veterans Portal.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2021.
