BACKGROUND: Some have suggested the need to ensure that the Alamo complex includes

features that focus on the 1836 battle, including those who fought in it and

their reasons for fighting as expressed in the Texas Declaration of

Independence.

DIGEST: CSHB 3013 would require the General Land Office to ensure that the

displays and exhibits located on the grounds of the Alamo complex, including those located in a museum prominently feature the story of the 1836 Battle of the Alamo, the history of the Texians and Tejanos who fought in the battle, and the grievances to the Mexican federal government listed in the Declaration of Independence of the Republic of Texas dated

March 2, 1836.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2021.
