BACKGROUND: Education Code sec. 25.112 limits a school district from enrolling more than 22 students in a kindergarten, first, second, third, or fourth grade class, with certain exceptions.

Interested parties contend that establishing the same student-to-teacher ratio for prekindergarten classes would increase their effectiveness.

DIGEST:
CSHB 41 would impose a class size limit for public school prekindergarten classes that did not exceed 22 students. The class-size requirement would apply to:

- a school district and open-enrollment charter school;
- a private entity operating a district's prekindergarten program under a contract;
- a private provider contracted to provide services or equipment for a district program; and
- a campus or program operated under a campus or campus program charter.

The bill would extend to charter schools the requirement that a campus or district that is granted an exception from class size limits must provide written notice of the exception to parents of affected students.

CSHB 41 would apply beginning with the 2021-2022 school year.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2021.

NOTES: According to the Legislative Budget Board, the bill would require school districts and charter schools that do not currently meet class size limits and ratio requirements to hire additional staff.
