# **DIGEST**

Currently, members of electric cooperative corporations have the opportunity to exempt the cooperative from rate regulation by the Public Utility Commission. However, in order for a cooperative to be exempt from rate regulation or to change its rate, the cooperative is required to file a cost of service study. This bill removes the requirement that an electric cooperative corporation complete a cost of service study when proposing a rate change, if the rate change is uncontested and the Public Utility Commission determines the study is unnecessary.

### **PURPOSE**

As proposed, H.B. 3037 removes the requirement that an electric cooperative corporation complete a cost of service study when proposing a rate change, if the rate increase is uncontested and the Public Utility Commission determines the study is unnecessary.

#### **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

### **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Section 2.2011, Article 1446c-0, V.T.C.S., to prohibit an electric cooperative corporation from being required to prepare or make available a cost-of-service study if the rate is uncontested and the Public Utility Commission determines a cost-of-service study is not necessary, which determination shall be made without a hearing.

SECTION 2. Effective date: September 1, 1997.

SECTION 3. Emergency clause.
