DIGEST

Currently, the House Licensing and Administrative Procedures Committee was charged with studying, in the interim, provisions that the Alcoholic Beverage Code during the 74th Legislative Session that appeared to be conflicting in nature. The committee conducted a review of the functions of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission to assure that administrative functions were performed in the most effective manner possible. One finding of the committee was that the recruitment section of the Alcoholic Beverage Code is obsolete. This bill would repeal Section 5.102, Alcoholic Beverage Code, regarding recruitment requirements for hiring personnel at the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.

PURPOSE

As proposed, H.B. 629 repeals Section 5.102, Alcoholic Beverage Code, regarding recruitment requirements for hiring personnel at the Texas Alcoholic beverage Commission.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

This bill does not grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Repealer: Section 5.102, Alcoholic Beverage Code (Recruitment).

SECTION 2. Emergency clause.
Effective date: upon passage.
