S.B. 99 By: Patterson State Affairs 1-16-97 As Filed

DIGEST

Currently, the law requires everyone to wear protective headgear while operating or riding on a motorcycle. Recent studies have shown motorcycle fatality rates to be unaffected by this legislation. This bill will rescind the helmet law for adults while providing that a minor commits a misdemeanor by operating or riding a motorcycle without protective headgear.

PURPOSE

As proposed, S.B. 99 provides that a minor commits a misdemeanor by operating or riding a motorcycle without protective headgear.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

This bill does not grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Amends Section 661.003, Transportation Code, as follows:

Sec. 661.003. New heading: OFFENSES RELATING TO NOT WEARING PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR BY MINOR. Provides that a person commits a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of not less than \$10 and not more than \$50 under this section if the person is younger than 18 years of age or operates or rides as a passenger on a motorcycle and is not wearing protective headgear. Makes conforming and nonsubstantive changes.

SECTION 2. (a) Effective date: September 1, 1997.

- (b) Makes application of this Act prospective.
- (c) Provides that this Act in conflict prevails over another Act of the 75th Legislature, Regular Session, 1997.

SECTION 3. Repealer: Section 1, Chapter 539, Acts of the 74th Legislature, Regular Session, 1995 (Protective Headgear for Motorcycle Operators and Passengers).

SECTION 4. Emergency clause.
