#### **DIGEST**

Currently, fireworks can only be sold to the public between June 24 and July 4 and between December 20 and January 1. County commissioners courts can issue orders banning aerial fireworks in a county due to drought conditions if the order is made before June 15 or December 15. This bill lengthens the time period that a county commissioners court has to issue an order prohibiting or restricting the use of aerial fireworks during drought conditions.

# **PURPOSE**

As proposed, S.B. 825 lengthens the time period that a county commissioners court has to issue an order prohibiting or restricting the use of aerial fireworks during drought conditions.

### **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

### SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Amends Section 240.904(d), Local Government Code, to require a county commissioners court to adopt an order to ban fireworks due to drought conditions by June 21, rather than June 15, for the Fourth of July fireworks season; and by December 17, rather than December 15, for each December fireworks season.

SECTION 2. Emergency clause.

Effective date: upon passage.
