DIGEST AND PURPOSE

Some children are sexually victimized by engaging in prostitution, pornography, and live sexual performances. Sexually abused children are likely to suffer emotionally as a result of their victimization. Under current law, "abuse" includes a person compelling, encouraging, or permitting child pornography or the sexual conduct of a child. As proposed, H.B. 360 expands the definition of "abuse" to include sexual performance by a child.
