### **DIGEST AND PURPOSE**

Currently the Texas Medical Practice act prohibits physicians from giving patients free medications under the Indigent Patient Program because of a definitional limitation. This bill corrects the definitional limitation, allowing physicians to give their indigent patients a full course of medication supplied by the pharmaceutical company without risk of infringing on pharmacists' dispensing authority.

# **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

### **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Section 158.001, Occupations Code, by adding Subsection (c), as follows:

(c) Provides that this chapter does not prohibit a physician from supplying to a patient, free of charge, a drug provided to the physician by a drug manufacturer for an indigent pharmaceutical program if, in the physician's opinion, it is advantageous to the patient, in adhering to a course of treatment prescribed by the physician, to receive the drug.

SECTION 2. Effective date: upon passage or September 1, 2001.

## **SUMMARY OF COMMITTEE CHANGES**

SECTION 1. Differs from the original by amending Section 158.001, Occupations Code, whereas the original amended Section 158.002 (a), Occupations Code., while the wording remains substantially the same.
