## **DIGEST AND PURPOSE**

Currently, child-care facilities must display signs with information on child abuse reporting procedures. As proposed, S.B. 52 directs the Department of Protective and Regulatory Services to require new signs that include information on at least two phenomena that adversely affect children's well-being, such as sudden infant death syndrome or shaken-baby syndrome, and methods for preventing those phenomena.

## **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

## **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Section 42.055(a), Human Resources Code, to require each child-care facility to post in a location that is conspicuous to all employees and customers a sign that includes a brief description of at least two phenomena that adversely affect children's well-being, such as sudden infant death syndrome or shaken-baby syndrome, and methods for preventing those phenomena.

SECTION 2. Effective date: upon passage or September 1, 2001.
