(i) County Mutual Companies (except (a) farm mutual insurance companies as authorized in Chapter 16 of this code; (b) county mutual fire insurance companies which are writing exclusively industrial fire insurance policies as defined in Article 17.02 of this code; and (c) any companies now operating under Chapters 12 and 13 of Title 78 of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended, which have heretofore been repealed.);

(ii) Lloyds; and

(iii) Reciprocal Exchanges;

and, to the extent necessary to bring such companies under the provisions of the Act, Chapters 15 through 19 inclusive of the Insurance code of the State of Texas are specifically amended."

The Committee Amendment was read and was adopted.

On motion of Senator Schwartz and by unanimous consent, the caption was amended to conform to the body of the bill as amended. (31-0) (31-0)

S.B. 867 (Herring)--

Senator Herring offered the following Committee Amendment to the bill:

On motion of Senator Brooks and by unanimous consent, the regular order of business was suspended to take up for consideration at this time on its second reading and passage to engrossment:

S.B. 465, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to requiring the Parks and Wildlife Department to determine the boundaries of state-owned land in and around Armand Bayou in Harris County; and declaring an emergency.

The bill was read second time.

Senator Brooks offered the following amendment to the bill:

Amend S.B. 465 to include after the words "Parks and Wildlife Department" where they appear consecutively in Section 1 of the bill the following: "and the General Land Office".

The amendment was read and was adopted.

On motion of Senator Brooks and by unanimous consent, the caption was amended to conform to the body of the bill as amended.

The bill as amended was passed to engrossment.

SENATE BILL 465 ON THIRD READING
