The year 1884 was an eventful one in the political history of the United States. Happily eventful, it is regarded by the Democrats of the Nation, and especially is it so regarded by the Democrats of the Southern States. The National Democratic Convention, to nominate candidates for President and Vice President, met at the exposition building, in the city of Chicago at noon on the 8th day of July, and was called to order by Hon. Wm. H. Barnum, of Connecticut, Chairman of the National Democratic Committee, and Texas was honored by the unanimous election of ex-Gov. Richard B. Hubbard as temporary Chairman. For permanent organization, Hon. Wm. R. Vilas, of Wisconsin, was chosen President. A platform was presented

and adopted, and balloting for candidates for President and Vice President resulted in the nomination of Grover Cleveland, of New York, for President, and Thomas A. Hendricks, of Indiana, for Vice President. Mr. Cleveland was put in nomination by Hon. Daniel N. Lockwood, of New York, who assured the Convention that his nomination would secure to the party the thirty-six electoral votes of New York, and at the polls on the 4th of November the people made Mr. Lockwood's assurance good. The electoral votes of the States of Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi Louisiana, Florida, Texas, Kentucky, Tennessee, Arkansas, Missouri, New York, Connecticut, New Jersey and Indiana were carried for the Democratic nominees, and on the 4th of March, A. D. 1885, Grover Cleveland and Thomas A. Hendricks will be inaugurated President and Vice President, and the Democratic party has promised the people an honest, pure and economical administration of the government.

TEXAS STATE DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION.

Just as the big clock on the Market House building in the City of Houston struck twelve, at noon, on Tuesday, the 19th day of August, 1884, Gen. John M. Claiborne, of Galveston, Chairman of the State Democratic Executive Committee, called the Texas State Democratic Convention to order in Armory Hall. It was the first State Democratic Convention held in Houston since the war, and the citizens had shown their appreciation of the event, not merely by a cordial welcome to the delegates, but by tastefully decorating the hall. The immense hall was filled to the utmost of its capacity by delegates and spectators, the delegates being comfortably seated and arranged conveniently for consultation and action.

Prayer was offered up to the Throne of Grace by the Rev. G. W. Briggs, pastor of the Charles Shearn Memorial Methodist Church South. Hon. Thomas R. Bonner, of Smith county, was chosen temporary chairman, and subsequently, Hon. Wm. F. Upton, of Fayette county, was elected permanent president. The following was adopted as the

TEXAS STATE DEMOCRATIC PLATFORM.

1. We, the Democrats of Texas, in convention assembled, cordially endorse the principles announced in the platform adopted by the National Convention of the Democratic party in the city of Chicago, in July last, and we hail with satisfaction the nomination of Grover Cleveland, of New York, and Hon. Thomas A. Hendricks, of Indiana, for President and Vice President of the United States, and we pledge our earnest and enthusiastic support to said nominees.
2. We declare that the people are the source of all political power; that

the Democratic party is a party of the people, and that it has with unflinching faith always adhered to the doctrine that government was instituted among men by their common consent for natural protection, and we point with pride to the great strides of our great commonwealth under its fostering care and protection.

3. We declare that a free ballot and fair count is necessary to the existence of free government among men, and the Democratic party pledges itself that this right shall remain inviolate.

4. We believe that an efficient system of common free schools, both for the white and colored races, is essential to the preservation of the liberties of its people, and that all our public institutions of learning should be fostered by judicious legislative enactment, and to this end we favor the raising of revenue for these purposes by such a disposition of the land set apart for these objects, under such limitations as may subserve these ends, so that taxation for such purposes may be reduced to the lowest possible limit.

5. We declare that the free school and asylum lands are segregated from the public domain, and are, by law, a sacred trust in the custody of the Legislature, to be held and managed in the best interest of the respective funds to which they have been dedicated, and we hold it to be the highest duty of the representatives of the people to see to it that that trust may not be sacrificed to the greed of any class.

6. We believe that the schools and general interest of our State will be best subserved by the leasing of said lands until such time as they may be purchased by actual settlers, at a reasonable price fixed by law, without competition, and in such a manner as not to retard the development and prosperity of the frontier.

7. We are opposed to the enactment of herd laws.

8. We believe that the existing laws of our State for the protection of mechanics and laborers by liens, should be more comprehensive and efficient, to the end that the real laborer may be thoroughly protected.

9. We declare that the Legislature of the State of Texas should limit the amount of real estate owned or held by corporations in this State, and that our corporation laws should be so amended as to prevent rather than encourage landed and other monopolies.

The nominations were: For Governor, John Ireland; Lieutenant Governor, Barnett Gibbs; Comptroller, Wm. J. Swain; Treasurer, Frank R. Lubbock; Commissioner of the General Land Office, William C. Walsh; Attorney General, John D. Templeton; Superintendent of Public Instruction, B. M. Baker. The nominees, with the exception of Mr. Baker, were already incumbents of the offices for which they were nominated, and were nominated for reelection by acclamation. They were thus afforded a grati-

fyng proof that in the discharge of their duties they had won the approbation of their party ; and the approbation of the people generally was manifested by a majority of more than one hundred thousand.

THE TEXAS STATE REPUBLICAN CONVENTION

Was also held in Houston. It assembled in Armory Hall on Tuesday, the 2d day of September, and was in session two days ; but neither adopted a platform or nominated a candidate for Governor or any other State office. It did nothing in that way, except to pass a resolution endorsing Hon. G. W. Jones, of Bastrop, for Governor, who subsequently announced himself as an independent candidate, but did not make a vigorous or general canvass, and was defeated by largely more than 100,000 majority against him.
